The Feast of Saint Blaise and the Blessing of Throats

Every 2nd of February the Church celebrates the feast of the Presentation of the Lord in the Temple, also known as the feast of the Purification of the Blessed Mother and Candlemas. Traditionally during the celebration of this liturgy, candles will be brought forth and blessed representing the “Light to the Nations” that Simeon prophesied of our Blessed Lord. Then on February 3rd, the feast of Saint Blaise, Bishop and Martyr of the early Church, the liturgy will often times include a blessing of throats with the recently blessed candles from the day before. These candles used on the Feast of Saint Blaise, symbolism the power through which this great Saint healed and brought many to Christ.

There are few facts known about St. Blaise except that he was a fourth-century bishop in the city of Sebaste, Western Armenia, and died as a martyr. Believed to be a physician, he was regarded as a righteous man and at an early age he was elected a bishop. As a Bishop and servant to his flock, Saint Blaise was known to be a healer, eventually being known as a “physician of souls.” He then retired to a cave, where he remained in prayer. People often turned to Saint Blaise for healing miracles.

In 316, the governor of Cappadocia arrested bishop Blaise for being a Christian. Legend has it that on their way to the jail, a woman set her only son, who was choking to death on a fish bone, at his feet.

Saint Blaise reached out and cured the child making him a patron Saint of those with ailments of the throat. Though his captors found this to be astonishing, it did not prevent them from martyring Blaise for his faith.

In time, the custom of blessing the throats of the faithful developed, with priests holding two tapered candles, blessed the day before on Candlemas, over the head or the throat while invoking the intercession of St. Blaise against any ailment of the throat and body.

Devotions, such as the blessing of throats on the feast of Saint Blaise, are essential parts of our Catholic lineage. These ceremonies and rituals are supposed to excite and elevate our hearts; one should come away refreshed and with a sense that something beyond the ordinary has just happened. All of the faithful are encouraged to go to mass and receive a blessing of throats on the feast of this great Saint of the early Church.

Last year we hosted almost 200 groups on pilgrimage and more than 160,000 pilgrims from all across the globe. As the pilgrimage planning coordinator for the National Shrine of Our Lady of Good Help, I am pleased to have spoken with so many pilgrims in the past year. As we look forward to the year 2020, our pilgrimage planning department is looking forward to helping you plan your journey to Champion Shrine.

During 2019, we opened our new Mother of Mercy Hall which allowed us to host pilgrimage groups as well

as larger groups for conferences and retreats. We have been able to utilize Mother of Mercy Hall for scheduling pilgrimage lunches, retreats, teacher/educational conferences, the Green Bay Youth Conference, the Order of Malta pilgrimage, and Marian feast day conferences. The building can be re-configured for groups from 10 to 1100, with even larger groups of up to 5,000 during summer months when we can also host indoor/outdoor events.

While you are welcome to come to Champion at any time on your own, to pray privately or with a group, there are ways in which we can help you organize a pilgrimage. Our pilgrimage planning department at the Shrine is here to assist you in that process, suggesting things to do, helping you with materials to organize a group for a bus trip and making suggestions on affordable travel and lodging to and from, Champion. We can help you

organize a pilgrimage for a group of individuals from your parish, for your school, group or family. We have many materials and resources to assist you to make your pilgrimage prayerful and meaningful. United by Faith: The Joy of Divine Providence of Connection through Events at Champion Shrine

We open the year 2020, one that marks the tenth anniversary of our designation as the first and only Church-approved Marian Apparition Site in America, with awe-filled thoughts of all the plot twists and turns in the Shrine's story that have brought us to this pivotal point in time at which we stand poised, as a beacon of the peaceful, healing, power of prayer, to unite pilgrims from across the globe, in Jesus' name, under the mantle of His Mother, and Our Blessed Mother, Mary.

It is oftentimes a seemingly innocuous choice or incident that may lead us here to Champion. But, for many of us whose lives have been changed here for the better, it has turned out to be a major twist of fate that plants a seed that comes to fruition for many years after. Some call these instances "coincidences." But, to the faithful who connect the dots, they are truly "God instances."

Those of us who either volunteer at Champion Shrine or have the good grace of calling the Shrine our workplace, see the seeds of these "God instances" come to fruition every day in the stories of graces experienced by those who felt called to pray here either at the Apparition Oratory (formerly called the crypt) or during formal Mass or Eucharistic Healing prayer service or just to walk the grounds.

One of those people was the beautiful lady pictured on the

front cover of this issue of our newsletter. Her name: Viola Naniot. On August 15 of the year 1917, filled with the Holy Spirit, Viola was determined to celebrate the Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary here on the grounds at Champion Shrine. How determined was she? Well, At 3 AM, Viola and three of her friends began an almost 20-mile (one way) walking journey to the grounds that marked the place where the "Queen of Heaven" had appeared, then known as the Chapel at Robinsonville.

Viola and her friends would begin this trek on foot, heading from Irwin Street in Green Bay, past Bay Beach up to Church Road, stopping at the Holy Cross School where there was an outdoor latrine and water pump. From there, they would head north, making it just in time for the traditional Feast Day Mass for the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary and the Eucharistic Rosary Procession that would follow.

Then came the walk back...an arduous feat to pull off on foot given that vast expanse of Humboldt Road on which they were walking was all gravel. Exhausted, with five hours walking left to go into the evening hours, Viola and her friends stopped alongside the road to rest.

Then, came one of those God instances.

A local farmer who had just finished milking cows for the day, had

decided to take out his new Model T Ford.

Traveling in the Model T down Humboldt Road, John Baenen came across the four weary lady travelers. Being a gentleman and worried for their safety at night, Baenen asked if they might like to ride with him into town. Not knowing whether or not they should take a ride from a stranger, the four ladies decided together it would be okay.

John Baenen and Viola Naniot struck up a conversation that evening that would continue throughout their entire lifetime. They began dating shortly thereafter, in August of 1917,

and, in April of 1920, just after the spring seeding was completed in March, the two married and became Mrs. And Mr. John Baenen. The picture on the front cover marks the fruition of a God instance.

Viola and John Baenen lived a wonderful life together on the farm, raising eight children there, including Leland Baenen, who still lives on the Baenen farm property just off County K, just a few miles from Champion and the National Shrine of Our Lady of Good Help. Leland, pictured below, was gracious enough to have shared that story in the year that marks the 100th anniversary of the union of his parents.

The Good Helpers Program is a vital program at the Shrine that has been quietly raising the funds needed to continue the Shrine's mission work for more than 10 years. When you become a member of the Good Helpers Program you are helping to make programs like Championing the Word Wednesdays with the Fathers of Mercy possible. Championing the Word Wednesdays is a free multiweek class, held at the Shrine, that helps pilgrims understand foundational Catholic principles. When you become a member of the Good Helpers Program you help make sure the Shrine can continue to foster conversion, teach the children and minister to the sick and old.

As a member of the Good Helpers Program you are taking an active role in the Shrine's mission by promising to pray one Hail Mary daily for the intentions and needs of the Shrine and are committed to supporting the Shrine with a donation. This donation is either through a one-time gift or a monthly recurring gift. For over the last 10 years there were only two levels to the Good Helpers Program, the Society of Adele and the Patrons of Our Lady. Each level had their own unique membership benefits.

With a one-time gift of \$120, or a \$10 monthly recurring gift for 12 months, you can join the **Society of Adele**. Your intentions will be included in the First Saturday Mass offered for members, a copy of the Shrine's newsletter,

The Good News, will be mailed to you and you will be recognized in the Shrine's Annual Report.

Adele's Wish List

Adele Brise was a visionary who had an unwavering faith in Jesus to help her carry out the mission entrusted to her by the Queen of Heaven here at Champion.
